54 TRAFFIC THROUGH THE VILLAGE AND ROAD MARKINGS

Towans Lorries Travelling Through Burtle - There now appear to be heavy lorries from other companies as well as Towans travelling through the village. Somerset Highways Traffic Management have advised that they are unable to take any actions regarding the number or size of lorries passing through the village as the road through the village is a public Highway.

Somerset Planning was approached in June in an attempt to try to understand if there are any projects in the area causing this increase in heavy lorries. No response has been received to date.

Somerset Councillors for Burtle have been made aware of the problems being caused and it was agreed to continue to pursue the matter and liaise with adjacent Parish Councils who are experiencing similar problems.

56 ITEMS OF INTEREST

Road Closure by Burtle Inn A road closure was advertised for Wednesday 4th September, the day of the Parish Council meeting, to allow a large crane to lift a prefabricated building into the rear garden of Huntspill House. Residents in the area had been advised of an interruption of their electricity supply on Thursday 5th September. The road was closed at 6.30am but sometime later it was opened as it appears that the wrong date had been advertised. Signs were then amended to show a closure the next day on 5th September.
